



TERMS OF USE OF DIGITAL DATA OF SITUATIONAL TRAFFIC INFORMATION

1. The digital data of situational traffic information (hereinafter referred to as "SDI") represent information on situation on roads (usually closures and longer-term restrictions of operation) created by the Slovak Road Administration (hereinafter referred to as "SRA") and geographical data for SDI.
2. SDI is provided in the DATEX II standard according to the series of international standards STN CEN/TS 16157 Intelligent transport systems. Data exchange specifications in DATEX II for traffic control and traffic information using the Pull method via a TLS-secured connection (https).
3. After acceptance of the request for making SDI available, the applicant will be sent a specification of the data contract, where the version of the DATEX II interface, the addresses, the range of messages and the localization method, including its parameters, will be indicated. The specification can be modified as needed.
4. After accepting the request, the applicant is issued an X.509 access certificate, without which access to the DATEX II data service is not possible. The validity of the certificate is usually 2 years, before the expiration date the applicant must apply for a new certificate.
5. Use of SDI is:
 - 5.1. free of charge
 - 5.2. non-exclusive,
 - 5.3. for commercial or non-commercial purposes, for the provision of value-added services, unless this is in conflict with applicable legislative regulations,
 - 5.4. for an indefinite period, while SSC is entitled to cancel it at any time and without giving a reason; in case of cancellation, the validity of the certificate will also be canceled according to point 4.
6. SRA is not responsible for any damage (including non-property damage and lost profit) incurred by the user or third parties in connection with the use or impossibility of using SDI and/or the interface for making SDI available. SRA is not responsible for errors or malfunctions of equipment, products and/or services in which SDI has been implemented. Furthermore, SRA assumes no responsibility for the completeness or accuracy of SDI, or for technical defects or errors in content.
7. The user is entitled to provide SDI to third parties only as an integral part of the products and/or services provided by him. Provision of SDI in raw form is permitted only with the written consent of SRA. In the case of providing SDI to third parties, the user undertakes to ensure that this third party undertakes to comply with these conditions when using the SDI, including the information that the SDI was provided by SRA according to point 8, and further the information about the disclaimer of SRA according to point 6.
8. When making SDI available to third parties in an unchanged form, the user is obliged to inform in a suitable way (especially on the user's website) that the SDI was provided by SRA by publishing the text: "The source of digital data of situational traffic information is Slovak Road Administration". When changing the content SDI not user authorized to list SSC as data source.
9. The user is not authorized to disclose information in connection with the use of SDI that would claim or imply that SSC is in any way connected with the user, product and/or service using SDI, or that SSC is responsible for the content of such product and/or services.
10. In case of non-compliance with the above conditions, the user will be sent a request for correction. Unless remedied within one month of the sending of this notice, access to SDI may be temporarily or permanently cancelled, without prejudice to sanctions arising from the law (in particular SSC's authority arising from the ownership of SDI).
11. SSC may at any time unilaterally modify the way SDI is made available or its format at any time, and will inform the user thereof, while it will endeavor to send this information at least six months before the relevant changes are made.
12. SSC is entitled to change or supplement the wording of these conditions at any time. The current version of the conditions will be sent to the user's contact email and will continue to be published on the website [DATA SERVICE FOR PROVIDING SITUATIONAL TRAFFIC INFORMATION | cdb.sk](https://www.cdb.sk).
